Professor Gipps joined the University in 2005. For the previous six years she was Deputy Vice Chancellor at Kingston University in Surrey, and prior to that was Professor of Education and Dean of Research at the Institute for Education in London.

She has a distinguished track record in higher education and a career which has included both teaching and research in a variety of institutions in the UK and Canada.

Professor Gipps studied psychology at the University of Bristol before completing an MSc and PhD in Psychology of Education at the Institute of Education.

Her career has included spells as a junior school teacher and also a teaching assistant at the University of British Columbia before joining the Institute of Education (IOE), where as Dean of Research she achieved a five-star grading for the IOE in the Research Assessment Exercise in 1986.

Caroline Gipps is a passionate advocate for the widening participation agenda and is the University of Wolverhampton's first female Vice-Chancellor.

Professor Gipps is Chair of the Wolverhampton Science Park Board and the Wolverhampton-Telford Technology Corridor.
